



Resize an Image with Specific Dimensions in Lightroom Classic and Export for PDI Competition

- **Select the Image(s) to Export**
 - In the Library or Develop module, select the photo(s) you want to export.
 - Use **Ctrl+Click** (Windows) or **Cmd+Click** (Mac) to select multiple photos.
- **Open the Export Dialog**
 - Go to the top menu and click on **File > Export...**, or press **Ctrl+Shift+E** (Windows) / **Cmd+Shift+E** (Mac).
- **Set the Export Location**
 - In the Export dialog under **Export Location**, choose where you want to save the exported file(s):
 - **Specific Folder:** Choose a specific directory on your computer.
 - Optionally enable **Put in Subfolder** to organize the exports in a new folder.
- **Choose File Format**
 - Under the **File Settings** section:
 - Set the **Image Format** to **JPEG**.
 - Set the **Quality** slider to your desired value (e.g., 80–100 for high quality).
 - Set **Color Space** to **sRGB**
- **Resize to Fit**
 - Under the **Image Sizing** section:
 - Check **Resize to Fit**.
 - From the drop-down menu, select **Width & Height**.
 - Enter **W: 1600** and **H: 1200** (in pixels).
 - Ensure the **Resolution** is set to **72 pixels per inch (ppi)** for web display or **300 ppi** for print.
- **Set Output Sharpening (Optional)**
 - Under **Output Sharpening**, check the box to sharpen the exported image.
 - Choose **Screen** for digital use or **Matte/Glossy Paper** for print.
 - Adjust the amount (Low, Standard, High).
- **Start the Export**
 - Click the **Export** button in the bottom-right corner of the dialog box.
- **Post-Processing**
 - **After export: Show in Finder** (macOS), **Show in Explorer** (Windows)

Your images will now be exported as JPEG files with a maximum width of 1600 pixels and a maximum height of 1200 pixels.
